4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Wash mouth and nasal passages with water repeatedly. Call a

Eye contact Immediately flush with plenty of water. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. Call a physi-

cian immediately.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed
